PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

A Word of Caution

One of our residents recently had a very unfortunate experience – their pet dog was killed. It is their belief that the pet was killed by a coyote. They have requested the WPPOA alert the pet owners of Woodside to be very cautious when allowing your pets to be outside.

The WPPOA has looked in to the potential of coyote presence in the area. Our research finds that coyotes are in the area and their habitat covers a wide area. There have been sightings of the coyote on properties close to Woodside therefore we can assume Woodside would be part of their territory.

The South Carolina Department of Natural Resources (SCDNR) reports that coyote primarily feed on rodents, rabbits, fruits, insects, deer fawn, poultry, small livestock and sometimes small pets. According to SCDNR, coyotes are most active starting at twilight and continuing throughout the night. Remember, your invisible fence will keep your pet in but it won't keep other animals out (i.e. the coyote). If you do not have an invisible fence, keep your pet on a leash. SCDNR says the coyote is very shy of humans and normally avoids their presence.

If you have an actual sighting of a coyote, please let us know. This will help us evaluate the extent of the coyote problem in Woodside.

Leftover Leftovers

Last February (2012) I wrote a mea culpa piece in the Covenants section of the POA monthly newsletter to the dog owners on the east side of Oakman Lake because I had published excerpts from a resident's complaint concerning barking dogs on the east side of Oakman Lake. It turned out later that the barking dogs belonged to people who live in Plantation South – a residential area adjacent to Woodside Plantation.

This year, I find myself writing another piece concerning Woodside canines and ask that "if the shoe fits – wear it, if not, then do not get upset" because I have no axe to grind when it comes to our canine residents.

Edited excerpts from a resident's complaint in December 2012:

"Over the past 11 years I have recovered from ever increasing attacks by dogs while walking, jogging and cycling on plantation paths and streets.

My specific concern is for the health and safety of children and other walkers, joggers and cyclists that regularly use the streets and paths in Woodside for play and exercise. Also, many of the seniors that engage in exercise on the Plantation's streets and paths are doing so because of heart conditions that are only exacerbated by barking and attacking dogs.

I suggest that the POA alert dog owners as to their responsibility for their dogs and for the safety of street and path users--especially children.

More specifically, I request a POA Newsletter encourage dog owners to:

- 1. Ensure that they restrict and restrain their dogs to their property.
- 2. Leash their dogs when off their property and on our streets and paths.
- 3. Regularly check their electronic and other fences use to restrict their dogs to their property.
- 4. Not leave house doors open allowing their dog to escape supervision.
- 5. Not put down their leash when distracted by other activities
 - (like talking with a neighbor or opening their mail box).
- 6. Consider the impact of barking and attacking dogs on the health and safety of other Woodside residents who use the streets and paths for play and exercise.

Thank you for your attention to this matter."

In closing, let me remind all dog owners that this resident's points are covered in our Covenants and in the regulations of the City of Aiken.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Time is running out. Your 2013 annual assessment is due no later than March 1, 2013 without penalty. Through the end of January about 30% of the annual assessment had been received. This is over twice of what was received at this time last year.

The 2013 Budget was included with the assessment notice. To answer some of the most commonly asked questions about the budget, here are some facts. There are currently 1,840 homes and 492 lots within Woodside Plantation. In addition to property owners, the Development Company pays an assessment on each of its unsold lots and also on any spec homes. Each Country Club is also assessed based on their respective golf holes.

The annual assessment was increased by 1.97%. Most of that increase will be deposited into the reserve account as the contribution percentage was increased from 10% in 2012 to 11% in 2013, an increase of \$20,000. Total operating expenses are estimated to be only \$9,650 greater than in 2012, a 0.6% increase. Included in the \$39,339 contingency fund is \$30,000 for the second phase of the landscaping strategic plan.

We currently have \$685,031 in the reserve accounts. We expect to add \$172,779 in 2013 for a total of \$857,810 plus some interest that may accrue. The only planned major road repairs will be on East Gate from the circle to the East Gate entrance. Total expense for this repair is expected to be less than this year's contribution, so the reserve account should continue to grow. The cost of perimeter fencing repairs should not exceed what has been budgeted.

The 2012 audit is in progress and the auditor will present his report at the March work session.

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW BOARD

Spring Spruce-Up and the ARB

Spring is just around the corner and many of us are looking at the exterior of our homes to determine what types of sprucing up and enhancements are necessary to maintain and improve the beauty of our properties.

Planting additions, of a minor nature, on the site are allowed without ARB approval. While each new home is required to submit a landscape plan, it is expected that homeowners may change, renew, and repair their plantings on a continuous basis. With the exception of cutting down trees, this does not require ARB approval.

What **does** require approval are additions or changes to your **hardscape**, which could include such things as walks, patios, statues, decorative and retaining walls, arbors, water features, gazebos, landscape lighting and other structural items either raised or at ground level. A property owner should contact the POA office if he/she is not sure if a plan is required.

If you are looking to make exterior building alterations (including additions or paint color changes) please submit the proposed plans including elevations, material specifications, finishes, color samples, revised site and landscape plan and construction schedule (as appropriate) for written approval by the ARB before starting your project.

The Property Owners' Association Architectural Review Board convenes twice a month on the second and fourth Mondays. Please submit your requests in a timely fashion to insure getting your project started at the appropriate time.

• As some of you have noticed, the much anticipated arrival of a horse hasn't happened! Unfortunately, the owner of the horse sold him in late December. Therefore, we are still looking for a new resident in our horse barn near the Main Gate. If you know of someone looking to board a horse, have them get in contact with the POA office. A resident horse or two would be a great asset to our community and our boarding rates are very inexpensive.

• One of my other areas of responsibility is the Community Garden Center. Many of you, like me, probably didn't know that Woodside had this great resource. It is located off of Basswood Drive near Woodside Plantation Drive. The Center is divided into two sections; an upper tier that is dedicated to pesticide-free gardening and a lower tier where pesticides may be used. Each plot is 12' x 12' and the rental is \$30.00 for the year. Water is available from several faucets throughout the complex. Please contact the POA office to rent one or more of the plots. You'll meet others who share your interest in gardening and you can exchange growing tips and suggestions for Southern gardens.

• The residents, who grow produce in the plots, usually have an overabundance of "crops" and they donate these items to an appropriate food bank in the Aiken area. These enthusiastic gardeners grow okra, beans, peas, lettuce, onions, tomatoes, squash, beets, cabbage, etc. They are also planning a "clean up" session in February, to get the plots prepared for the spring planting. SECURITY

Sometimes it becomes confusing as to the duties and responsibilities of the WPPOA security force. Our security force is essentially responsible for gate access and routine patrols. They do their best to ensure that Woodside residents and their guests (including vendors) are allowed to enter Woodside. They patrol Woodside at night looking for anything that seems unusual and report it to the Aiken Department of Public Safety (ADPS). They do not carry guns, nor do they have any police training. Our security provides crime deterrent not crime prevention. If you have an emergency, are involved in a crime or witness something unusual, your first call should be to ADPS (911) and a second call to Woodside security.

Public Safety has provided a helpful list of crime prevention tips for your home.

- Use deadbolt locks on all exterior doors. Keep your doors locked at all times, even when you're inside.
- Protect windows and sliding glass doors with good locks or other security devices.
- Make your home appear occupied when you go out by using a timer to turn on lights an a radio.
- Never let strangers in your home without checking their identification. Call their company.
- If you live alone, don't advertise it. Use only your first initial in phone directories.
- Get to know your neighbors and keep their phone numbers handy for emergencies.
- Work a buddy system with a friend to check on each other daily.
- Don't hide extra house keys under a doormat or other obvious spots.

• Question things that appear to be out of the ordinary. If you see something that's not right, call Public Safety at 911. **Basswood Drive**

Speeding continues to be a common problem in Woodside. Recently ADPS focused attention on Basswood Drive to apprehend those drivers who use Basswood to get to East Gate Drive. During a two-day patrol, ADPS issued 17 citations for speeding and failure to stop at a stop sign. I would encourage residents who do not live on Basswood Drive to use Woodside Plantation Drive to get to East Gate Drive.

COMMON AREA LANDSCAPING

Strategic Landscaping Plan

We are in year 3 of our 4 year strategic landscaping plan. The intent of the plan is to address the nine mile expanse of roadside (both sides of the street) along Woodside Plantation Drive (WPD) and East Gate Drive (EGD). These were deemed to be the worst looking and most visible roads in Woodside. They are about 25 years old and in bad need of rejuvenation. The plan is designed to replace the worn out landscaping with landscaping that will cost less to maintain, by:

- Using more perennials
- Planting appropriate ground covers in areas where there is insufficient light to grow grass
- Allowing the planted ground covers to replace annual mulching
- Planting strong Bermuda grass (plugs) along the roadsides which will enable us to consider not rye overseeding in the winter

Phase I of our four year plan was accomplished in 2011. It encompassed the area just past the Main Gate, down to Mulberry Court, and the area between Winged Elm Circle and Cottonwood Creek Lane.

Phase II was accomplished in 2012. It encompassed the areas between Winged Elm and South Gate (both sides of the road) and between Boxwood and Boxwood (The Cottages side of the road). In addition, we replaced three of the Bradford Pear trees at the Main Gate with magnolias.


Phase III will begin in the spring of this year. It will encompass the following:

- Redoing the islands in front of Woodside Country Club and Club Villas
- Rejuvenating the area on EGD around Tall Pine
- Replacing 2 more of the overgrown trees at the main gate with a magnolia and a cherry tree

Our intent is to take long term actions to build up the roadsides so they will always look good and reduce our maintenance costs.

Rejuvenating Pruning

Don't be alarmed if some of your favorite plants and/or shrubs look scalped. They're really OK. We are doing our annual rejuvenating pruning to ensure that our plants and shrubs remain healthy and well shaped.



LAKES & DAMS

Granite Ridge Aquatic Services performed their monthly inspection on January 22nd. There is a small leak in the "weir" (the overflow structure) on Royal Lake, which they attempted to repair. They were only partially successful, so we have contacted a more specialized company to help us plug the leak. Granite Ridge also reported Burden Lake has a very small amount of "floating hearts" in some areas, which will be treated this month. The other lakes look good.

The South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) came to Woodside Plantation on January 7, 2013, to perform their biannual inspection of four of the five dams the POA is responsible for (Oakman, Holley, Burden, and Royal; Magnolia is not large enough to require an inspection). The only dam which had discrepancies was Holley. The items were quite minor and will be corrected within the next thirty days, and a correction report will be sent back to DHEC. The inspector was very pleased with the condition of the dams and the way they are maintained.
